RE: JOINT WORKSHOP WITH THE SCHOOL BOARD

Mr. Catalano opened the workshop with the school board to discuss issues of shared interest including a need for a future enrollment study, facilities including field space, and the need for resources to support students' emotional wellbeing. Superintendent of Schools Dr. Andrea Whitmarsh said a future enrollment study will help the division get a better idea how to plan for facilities needs. She noted that in 2015 the division did a facilities study that can be found on the system's website and the first step of that plan was the additional space in the middle and high schools and unless an enrollment study proves differently, the next step of a new elementary school is not yet needed, but it will be at some point in the future. She said that one of the things that the school division desperately needs, though, is field space for the students. Ms. Katie Brunelle, Director of Administrative Services, also noted that the use of natural grass is not conducive to year-round use. She also noted that the County has seen a growth in recreational participation and there is often a lack of space to accommodate basketball and cheerleading, as well as the building of pickleball courts. Mr. Catalano said he'd like to see Transient Occupancy Tax funding go toward the building of a multipurpose recreational facility. Ms. Schafrik said there is a small group of people working toward a YMCA but a problem is there is not an identified piece of land for it to go. Mr. McGuigan asked about a park master plan that was discussed last year, but Ms. Schafrik said it was not funded during the budget discussions. Ms. Whitmarsh and Ms. Schafrik said they would like to see more mental health support as well. Ms. Whitmarsh also noted the need for community services to provide ongoing support for students after they graduate.

Jim Frydl presented the request to rezone the property at 8834 Spotswood Trail from R-1 to B-3. If someone has been in operation for 15 years or greater, under the same ownership, they

can apply for rezoning at no fee under Virginia State Code. Mr. Frydl said this encourages correcting the zoning designation for a business that has been operating in a particular way. Snead's Auto is in a location that has operated as a commercial establishment for about 70 years. Nothing else is changing.

Staff agreed to come back at a future meeting with more detailed estimates and a recommendation for paying for the renovation.

Mr. Goolsby reported on his participation in the Thomas Jefferson Planning and District Committee meeting. Mr. McGuigan discussed the Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee meeting regarding the upcoming agritourism ordinance revision and the definition of "bona fide agricultural operation." Mr. McGuigan suggested that the Agricultural and Forestal

District Advisory Committee could hold a special meeting in January to give input to the Board of Supervisors regarding the definition of bona fide agriculture in the ordinance.

Ms. Schafrik provided a comprehensive update, highlighting recent and upcoming community events such as the power lifting event with Parks and Recreation, and the tree lighting celebration in Greene Commons. Ms. Schafrik promoted upcoming activities, including the EMS Citizen Academy for later in the week.

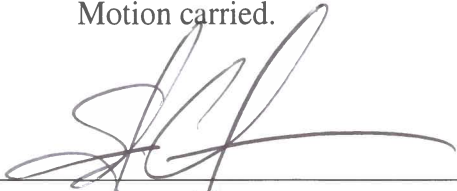

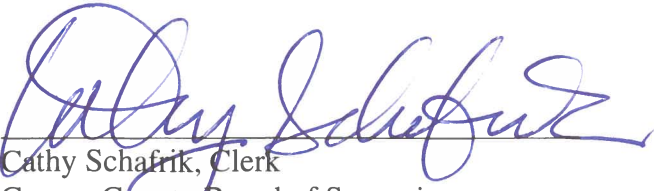

AN ORDINANCE (O-2025-009) TO REZONE PARCEL TMP# 37D-(A)-2B, WHICH ENCOMPASSES 0.52 ACRES, TO CHANGE ITS DESIGNATION FROM R-1 (RESIDENTIAL) TO B-3 (BUSINESS HIGHWAY AND HIGH INTENSITY). THE PARCEL IS LOCATED AT 8834 SPOTSWOOD TRAIL. ACCORDING TO THE GREENE COUNTY FUTURE LAND USE MAP, THIS PARCEL IS CLASSIFIED AS MIXED USE RESIDENTIAL, AND THE GREENE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN IDENTIFIES IT AS BEING WITHIN THE DESIGNATED GROWTH AREA. (RZ#25-002)

WHEREAS, §15.2-1427 and §15.2-1433 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as may be amended from time to time, enable a local governing body to adopt, amend and codify ordinances or portions thereof; and

WHEREAS, §15.2-2280, §15.2-2285, and §15.2-2286 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, enables a local governing body to adopt and amend zoning ordinances; and

WHEREAS the Greene County Planning Commission advertised and held a public hearing on the proposed rezoning on November 19, 2025, and all of those who spoke on this topic were heard; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Planning Commission voted 4-0 to recommend approval of the request to rezone the subject property; and

WHEREAS, public necessity, convenience, general welfare, and good zoning practice support approval of this rezoning and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Supervisors caused to be published a notice of public hearing on this matter in the Piedmont Journal Recorder on November 26, 2025, and December 3, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the full text of this request was available for public inspection in the Greene County Administrator's Office, County Administration Building, 40 Celt Road, Stanardsville, Virginia 22973; and

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2025, the Greene County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on this matter, and all those who spoke on this topic were heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Greene County Board of Supervisors hereby approves Ordinance O-2025-009 to rezone parcel TMP# 37D-(A)-2B, which encompasses 0.52 acres, to change its designation from R-1 (Residential) to B-3 (Business Highway and High Intensity). The parcel is located at 8834 Spotswood Trail. According to the Greene County Future Land Use Map, this parcel is classified as Mixed Use Residential, and the Greene County Comprehensive Plan identifies it as being within the designated growth area. (RZ#25-002)

WHEREAS, Greene County recognizes the importance of preserving and expanding public parkland for recreation, conservation, and future community needs; and

WHEREAS, a parcel of land adjacent to the existing Park property has been identified as beneficial for expansion, improved access, and long-range planning; and

WHEREAS, acquiring this adjacent property is in the best interest of Greene County and supports ongoing efforts to protect open space and enhance public facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Supervisors finds it necessary and appropriate to authorize the County Administrator to take all steps required to complete the purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Greene County Board of Supervisors that:

1. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to proceed with the purchase of the parcel of land adjacent to the Park property.
2. The County Administrator is further authorized to execute all documents, agreements, and actions necessary to complete the acquisition, subject to review by the County Attorney.
3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

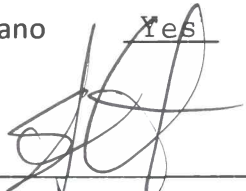

**A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE GREENE COUNTY PLANNING
COMMISSION TO REVIEW THE PROPOSED LAND FOR A PUBLIC PARK
FOR SUBSTANTIAL ACCORD WITH THE COUNTY'S COMPREHENSIVE
PLAN**

WHEREAS, Sections 15.2-1427 and 15.2-1433 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as may be amended from time to time, enable a local governing body to adopt resolutions for the governance of the county; and

WHEREAS, Section 15.2-2232 of the Code of Virginia requires that whenever a governing body proposes to establish a park or other public area, the general location, character, and extent thereof shall be submitted to the local planning commission for a determination as to whether the proposal is substantially in accord with the adopted comprehensive plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors is acquiring certain real property within the County for the express purpose of establishing a new public park and open space area to meet the growing recreational needs of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the provision of public parks and recreational facilities serves the public interest by promoting health and wellness, enhancing the quality of life, preserving open space, and protecting the County's natural resources, all of which are stated goals within the Greene County Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, as a necessary procedural step prior to authorizing the acquisition and development of such a public facility, the Board of Supervisors must formally refer the matter to the Greene County Planning Commission for its review and determination as mandated by state law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds that initiating this review is essential to ensure that the potential park aligns with the long-term strategic vision for the County and serves the public health, safety, and general welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF GREENE that:

Section 1. Referral to the Planning Commission

The Greene County Board of Supervisors hereby formally directs and refers to the Greene County Planning Commission the matter of the proposed acquisition of land for the development of a new public park. The Planning Commission is directed to review the proposal and make a finding as to whether the general location, character, and extent of the proposed public park are substantially in accord with the Greene County Comprehensive Plan.

Section 2. Implementation and Reporting

The County Administrator is hereby directed to transmit this Resolution and all relevant supporting documentation concerning the proposed parkland acquisition to the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission is requested to conduct its review in a timely manner, hold such public hearings as it may deem necessary or as are required by law, and communicate its findings and written reasons therefore to the Board of Supervisors in accordance with the procedures set forth in Virginia Code § 15.2-2232.

Section 3. Effective Date

This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption by the Board of Supervisors.

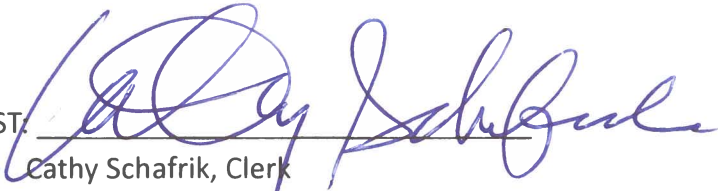

Resolution Requesting Recognition of GO Virginia Region 9 as a Distinct Tourism Region

WHEREAS, the Virginia Tourism Corporation (VTC) currently recognizes the Central Virginia Tourism Region as encompassing an extensive collection of counties, including Madison, Greene, Albemarle, Louisa, Fluvanna, Nelson, Charlottesville, Amherst, Campbell, Appomattox, Prince Edward, Nottoway, Buckingham, Cumberland, Goochland, Hanover, Powhatan, Amelia, Dinwiddie, Chesterfield, Henrico, Prince George, and Sussex; and

WHEREAS, VTC currently recognizes the Northern Virginia Tourism Region as encompassing the eclectic counties of Culpeper, Rappahannock, Fauquier, Arlington, Fairfax, Prince William, Stafford, Spotsylvania, and Caroline; and

WHEREAS, these two VTC regions do not align with tourists' travel tendencies, nor support any cohesive tourism identity or unified marketing strategy, and

WHEREAS, the counties/cities of Fauquier, Rappahannock, Culpeper, Orange, Madison, Greene, Fluvanna, Louisa, Albemarle, Charlottesville, and Nelson currently work collaboratively through GO Virginia Region 9 (hereafter "The Region") to advance shared goals in economic development, workforce, and entrepreneurship; and

WHEREAS, these same counties share distinct tourism commonalities, including rich agricultural landscapes, vibrant main streets, historic sites, wineries and breweries, and proximity to the Blue Ridge Mountains and Shenandoah National Park, creating a natural and unified visitor experience where visitors travel organically within The Region's lodging, dining and recreating — reinforcing a shared tourism ecosystem that functions as a single destination market; and

WHEREAS, The Region's steep history, serves as home to two of America's most significant presidential estates — Monticello and James Madison's Montpelier — as well as historic properties such as Airlie Resort, Barboursville Ruins, and countless Civil War and early American sites; and

WHEREAS, The Region offers unparalleled outdoor recreation opportunities, including the Blue Ridge Mountains and the Shenandoah National Park, a national treasure drawing over 1.2 million visitors annually, complemented by regional attractions such as the James River Water Trail, Rapidan Wildlife Management Area, and numerous cycling, hiking, and agritourism routes; and

WHEREAS, The Region is home to the Virginia's most award winning wine and internationally acclaimed Monticello American Viticultural Area (AVA), recognized as the birthplace of Virginia wine and consistently awarded among the nation's best, attracting both domestic and international visitors; and

WHEREAS, The Region's towns and rural communities — from Lovingson to Stanardsville, Orange,

Culpeper, Madison, Sperryville, Washington, and Warrenton — embody the Virginia Main Street small-town charm, authenticity, and countryside beauty that define Virginia's tourism brand; and

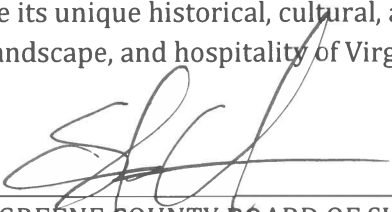

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the localities of Fauquier, Rappahannock, Culpeper, Orange, Madison, Greene, Fluvanna, Louisa, Albemarle, Charlottesville, and Nelson hereby respectfully request that the Virginia Tourism Corporation formally recognize GO Virginia Region 9 as an independent and distinct tourism region known as **Virginia's Piedmont** within the Commonwealth; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this newly recognized region be empowered to collaboratively promote its unique historical, cultural, and natural assets under a shared identity that reflects the spirit, landscape, and hospitality of Virginia's Piedmont and Blue Ridge Mountains.

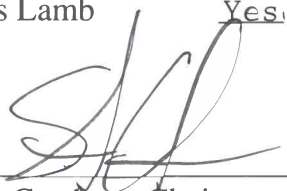

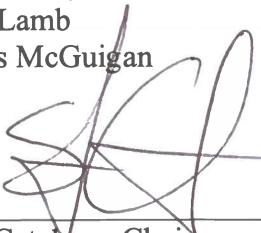

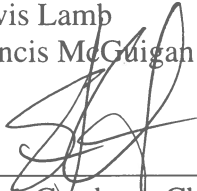

**RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT
FOR A TURN LANE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT ON US 33 BUSINESS AND MONROE
DRIVE**

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Supervisors recognizes the importance of maintaining safe and efficient transportation routes for county residents, school traffic, and the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, significant traffic backups occur along US 33 Business at the intersection with Monroe Drive during school arrival and dismissal times, resulting in queues extending into the travel lanes and blocking through-traffic movements; and

WHEREAS, these traffic conditions have led to vehicles crossing into the oncoming traffic lane to bypass delays, creating a hazardous situation with increased potential for conflicts with oncoming vehicles and turning movements at the intersection; and

WHEREAS, the current intersection configuration lacks adequate turn lane capacity to safely manage peak-period volumes associated with nearby schools and residential traffic; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Supervisors finds that a dedicated turn lane improvement project at this location would relieve congestion, improve traffic flow, reduce safety risks, and enhance overall roadway operations; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) has the authority and expertise to evaluate, design, and implement roadway improvements within the state-maintained highway system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Board of Supervisors hereby expresses its full support for VDOT to evaluate, prioritize, and proceed with a turn lane improvement project at the intersection of US 33 Business and Monroe Drive; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board encourages VDOT to consider this project for available funding and programming opportunities, given the documented safety concerns and daily traffic impacts on county residents.

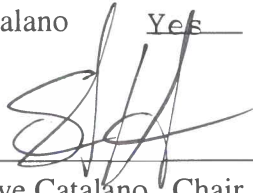

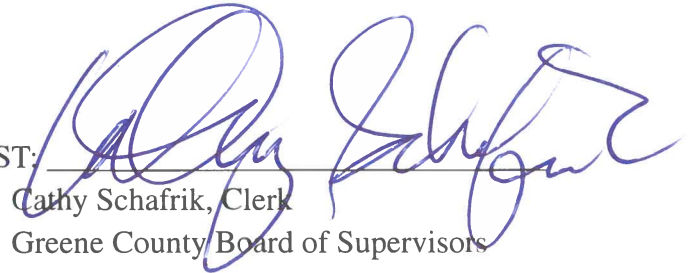
