RE: MATTERS FROM THE PUBLIC

Ms. Jennifer Lewis-Fowler, Director of Elections, said that early voting had begun for the April 21, 2026, Election, and that 10% of registered voters had already voted early in person or via absentee ballot. She also announced that VDOT would be closing Stanard Street for work on the sidewalks, but that early voting would continue by entrance off Ford Avenue into the parking lot.

Ms. Carolyn Feazel told the Board she wanted them to pass a new 2A resolution that was more similar to the one from 2019 instead of the one passed at the March 10, 2026, meeting.

RE: WATER PROJECT MONTHLY UPDATE

Mr. Herb White from WW Associates presented an update on the two reservoir-related projects underway in Greene County. Construction of the raw water line has begun near the water treatment plant with roughly 500 feet of piping laid since the previous meeting. English Construction had pumped up the two smaller sludge lagoons at the existing water plant in preparation of emptying the larger lagoon and bypassing it as part of the pump station work. The larger lagoon will be removed and that is where the pump station will be placed. WW Associates

is updating drawings for the reservoir project, lowering the dam six feet and other improvements to the dam for the water plant.

RE: CONSIDERATION OF APPEAL REGARDING PUBLIC WATER AND SEWER CONNECTION REQUIREMENTS

Mr. Frydl told the Board a business was requesting an appeal to locate in the industrial park but utilize wells for the non-potable water his business would need and only connect one water and one sewer EDU to the system for bathrooms at the facility. The ordinance notes that within the industrial zoning district, a business must connect to public water for new construction, which Mr. Frydl said basically what the potential business is proposing. He said the business would meet the ordinance requirement of connecting, but that it is up to the Board if it is in compliance with the ordinance if they utilize wells for the non-potable water needed for its business.

Ms. Durrer said she had concerns about creating a precedent that appears to go against the ordinance. Mr. Lamb said approving the appeal would not be fair to other businesses that have paid full connection fees for their businesses. Mr. Catalano said the proposal is only connecting a bathroom when connecting refers to connecting enough EDUs for the amount of water needed. He also was concerned about a commercial well impacting groundwater supplies for others in the area. He said if the Board approved it it is going against the financial model for the water system.

Ms. Schafrik discussed the resolution opposing the state's mandatory collective bargaining legislation that was headed to the governor's desk. She said it is not a one-size-fits-all solution. She read the resolution and added that the General Assembly did not make it mandatory for state agencies, however.

Mr. Catalano said allowing collective bargaining will destroy the county's ability for financial planning. He said it takes away local choice.

Ms. Schafrik added that there is a lot of administrative work and time that must go into negotiating with unions.

Mr. Hartung noted it affects both the county and the school system.

Mr. Catalano said he would talk with the departments further. He directed Ms. Schafrik to notify the Commissioner of Revenue of the Board's consensus.

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-002

A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE AGRICULTURAL AND FORESTAL DISTRICT ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO UNDERTAKE EDUCATIONAL AND PLANNING INITIATIVES

WHEREAS, Sections 15.2-1427 and 15.2-1433 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as may be amended from time to time, enable a local governing body to adopt resolutions for the governance of the county; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agricultural and Forestal Districts Act, specifically § 15.2-4304 of the Code of Virginia, Greene County has established an Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee ("the Committee") to advise the Board of Supervisors on the administration of the County's Agricultural and Forestal Districts; and

WHEREAS, the preservation of agricultural and forestal lands is a fundamental objective of the Greene County Comprehensive Plan and is vital to the County's economy, rural character, and environmental health; and

WHEREAS, effective and ongoing education for landowners is essential to promote voluntary participation in and ensure the long-term success of the Agricultural and Forestal District program, as well as to increase awareness of conservation tools, land use taxation incentives, and best management practices that support the protection of the County's agricultural soils, forest resources, and water quality; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Cooperative Extension, in partnership with state and federal agencies and local conservation organizations, serves as a key resource for providing such education and technical assistance to landowners;

WHEREAS, the forthcoming 2027/2028 review of the Greene County Comprehensive Plan, mandated by § 15.2-2223 of the Code of Virginia, requires the expert input of the Committee to ensure that strategies for agricultural and forestal preservation are robustly integrated into the County's long-range vision; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds that directing the Committee to engage in these proactive educational and planning activities is necessary and serves the public interest by strengthening the County's commitment to its agricultural and forestal resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF GREENE that:

Section 1. Landowner Education Program

The Greene County Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee is hereby directed to collaborate with, review, and assist the Virginia Cooperative Extension Agency and other relevant partner agencies in the development and implementation of the first annual landowner education

program. The program shall focus on informing current and prospective participants about the benefits, requirements, and stewardship responsibilities associated with enrollment in the County's Agricultural and Forestal Districts, as well as increasing awareness of conservation tools, land use taxation incentives, and best management practices that support the long-term protection of Greene County's agricultural lands, forest resources, water quality, and soil health.

Section 2. Comprehensive Plan Review Preparation

The Greene County Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee is further directed to commence preparations for its substantive participation in the 2027/2028 Comprehensive Plan review process. These preparations shall include, but are not limited to, identifying key issues impacting agriculture and forestry, gathering relevant data, and formulating policy recommendations to ensure the goals of the Agricultural and Forestal Districts Act are effectively advanced in the updated Comprehensive Plan.

Section 3. Effective Date

This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption by the Board of Supervisors.

**RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE VIRGINIA JUVENILE
COMMUNITY CRIME CONTROL ACT PLAN MERGER FOR
THE COUNTIES OF ORANGE, MADISON, AND GREENE**

WHEREAS, the Virginia Juvenile Community Crime Act (VJCCCA) was established to provide community-based services for juvenile offenders and youth at risk of delinquency; and

WHEREAS, participation in the VJCCCA promotes public safety, reduces juvenile recidivism, and strengthens community-based alternatives to detention; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides state funds to assist localities in planning, developing, and implementing effective programs tailored to the needs of their youth populations; and

WHEREAS, the governing body recognizes the importance of a comprehensive local community-based system of sanctions and services for juveniles; and

WHEREAS, Greene County desires to continue its participation in the VJCCCA and to partner with neighboring localities for the joint administration of programs and services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Board of Supervisors will participate in the Virginia Juvenile Community Crime Control Act and accepts funds appropriated for the purposes set forth in this Act until it notifies the Department of Juvenile Justice, in writing, that it no longer wishes to participate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Greene County will combine with the governing bodies of Madison and Orange Counties for the administrations of services under this Act, and that Orange County will serve as the fiscal agent for these localities.

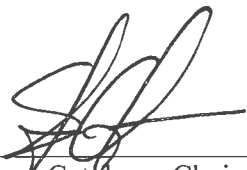

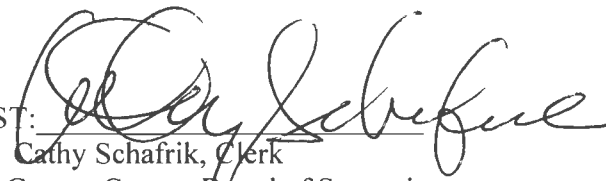

PROCLAMATION

Child Abuse Prevention Month April 2026

WHEREAS, Child Abuse Prevention Month is observed each April to raise awareness of the importance of preventing child abuse and neglect and to affirm our community's shared responsibility to support children and families; and

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect remain serious public health and social concerns affecting children and families across our region; and

WHEREAS, strong families, supportive relationships, and engaged communities contribute to positive outcomes for children; and

WHEREAS, prevention and early intervention efforts — including education, family support, and community engagement — help strengthen protective factors for children and caregivers; and

WHEREAS, collaborative partnerships among families, schools, community organizations, faith groups, health care providers, law enforcement, and Departments of Social Services enhance our community's coordinated response to child abuse and neglect; and

WHEREAS, Children's Advocacy Centers (CACs) are codified in the Code of Virginia as part of the Commonwealth's response to child abuse and neglect, serving as the neutral, child-focused setting for forensic interviews, medical examinations, family advocacy, and multidisciplinary team case review; and

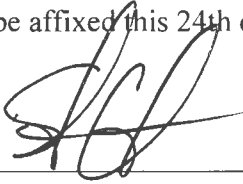
WHEREAS, Foothills Children's Advocacy Center has partnered for 20 years with law enforcement, the Department of Social Services, and the Commonwealth's Attorney's Office, conducting an average of more than 300 forensic interviews annually to support criminal investigations and prosecution efforts; and

WHEREAS, this community recognizes the importance of continued awareness, collaboration, and resources to support children and families impacted by abuse;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors for Greene County, Virginia, do hereby proclaim **April 2026 as Child Abuse Prevention Month** in Greene County and urge all residents, community organizations, businesses, and institutions to renew their commitment to protecting

children, supporting families, increasing awareness of child abuse prevention resources, and participating in activities that promote child well-being.

RESOLUTION AFFIRMING THE SECOND AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution reads: “A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed;” and

WHEREAS, Article 1, Section 13 of the Constitution of Virginia provides “that a well regulated militia, composed of the body of the people, trained to arms, is the proper, natural, and safe defense of a free state, therefore, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed; that standing armies, in time of peace, shall be avoided as dangerous to liberty; and that in all cases the military should be under strict subordination to, and governed by, the civil power;” and

WHEREAS, there has been legislation proposed for 2026 session of the Virginia General Assembly that could have the effect of infringing in the rights of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, as guaranteed by the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution and Article 1, Section 13 of the Constitution of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of supervisors is concerned about the passage of any bill containing language which could be interpreted as infringing on the rights of the citizens of Greene County to keep and bear arms or could begin a slippery slope of restrictions on the Constitutional rights of the citizens of Greene County; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Supervisors wishes to express its deep commitment to the rights of all citizens of Greene County to keep and bear arms while recognizing that the enforcement of any legislation originating from the Virginia General Assembly is the responsibility of the constitutionally elected Sheriff and Commonwealth’s Attorney; and

WHEREAS, no appropriation is and shall be made by the Greene County Board of Supervisors for the enforcement of unconstitutional gun laws in the County of Greene; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Supervisors wishes to express opposition to laws which would unconstitutionally restrict the rights of the citizens of Greene County to keep and bear arms.

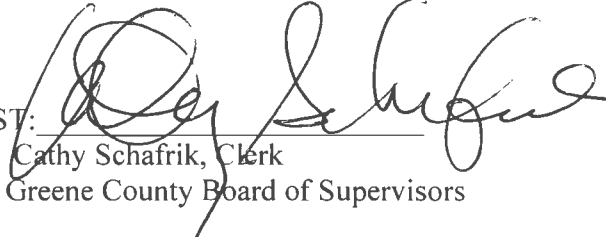

**RESOLUTION OF THE GREENE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
DENYING THE REQUEST REGARDING PUBLIC WATER CONNECTION
REQUIREMENTS
FOR THE PROPOSED BLUE RIDGE READY MIX, LLC FACILITY**

WHEREAS, Blue Ridge Ready Mix, LLC has expressed its intent to locate and expand its operations in Greene County, Virginia, at a site on Business Park Drive (TMP 50-A-2-10) in Ruckersville, Virginia, subject to approval by the Greene County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the proposed facility would include manufacturing, storage, office, and retail space associated with a concrete batching and precast manufacturing operation; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has proposed to connect only office, retail, and employee-occupied structures to public water and sewer systems, while utilizing on-site wells to supply water necessary for the concrete manufacturing process; and

WHEREAS, Section 16-17-2(A) of the Greene County Zoning Ordinance requires public water connection for new construction in the M-2 (Heavy Industrial) Zoning District where such service is available; and

WHEREAS, Section 16-17-3(A) of the Greene County Zoning Ordinance requires sanitary sewer connection for new construction consistent with Virginia Code § 15.2-2121; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has carefully reviewed the applicant's request and the applicable provisions of the Greene County Zoning Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Board of Supervisors hereby denies the request to allow the use of on-site wells in lieu of full connection to public water for the proposed Blue Ridge Ready Mix, LLC facility, for the following reasons:

1. Ordinance Compliance and Equity:

Allowing a business to connect only bathrooms and occupied structures to public

water, while not connecting water used for production, does not meet the requirements and intent of the Greene County Zoning Ordinance. Granting such a request would create an inequity among businesses that have been required to fully connect to public water systems.

2. **Water Supply and Adjacent Well Impacts:**

The Board has concerns regarding the quantity of water that would be withdrawn from a commercial well to support industrial operations, and the potential adverse impacts such withdrawals may have on nearby private wells and groundwater resources.

3. **Consistency with County Financial Planning:**

The requested exemption does not support the County's financial model and projections developed to fund and sustain current and future public water infrastructure projects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all development associated with the proposed facility shall comply with applicable Greene County ordinances, including requirements for connection to public water and sewer systems where required.

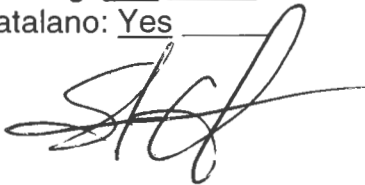

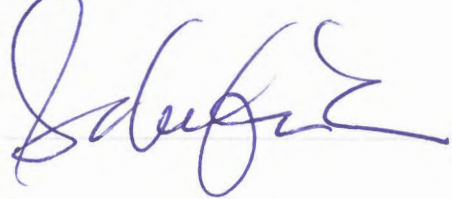
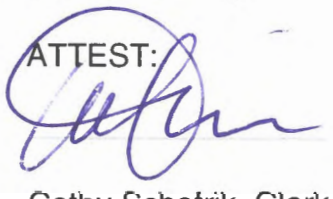

RESOLUTION OPPOSING MANDATORY COLLECTIVE BARGAINING LEGISLATION (HB 1263 / SB 378)

WHEREAS, current Virginia law provides a local option allowing governing bodies to determine whether and how to engage in collective bargaining based on local fiscal capacity, workforce needs, and service priorities; and

WHEREAS, HB 1263 and SB 378 would eliminate this local option and impose a state-mandated, one-size-fits-all collective bargaining framework administered by a Public Employee Relations Board (PERB); and

WHEREAS, this legislation shifts authority away from locally elected officials and imposes an unfunded mandate with significant fiscal and administrative consequences for local governments and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, Virginia's localities vary widely in population, resources, and service delivery models, and are best positioned to make decisions that reflect their unique circumstances; and

WHEREAS, mandatory collective bargaining as proposed would: Divert limited local resources from core services to new administrative and bargaining structures without dedicated funding; Eliminate local flexibility to align workforce decisions with budgets and service needs; Create unpredictable fiscal obligations through arbitration and expanded dispute resolution processes; Increase administrative burden, litigation risk, and long-term costs for local taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, local governments must maintain balanced budgets while continuing to provide essential services, including public safety, education, and infrastructure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Board of Supervisors strongly opposes HB 1263 and SB 378 and any legislation that mandates collective bargaining for local governments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board urges the Governor and members of the Virginia General Assembly to preserve local authority over workforce and labor relations policies; and

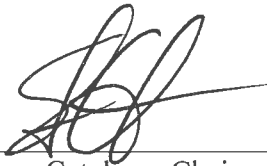

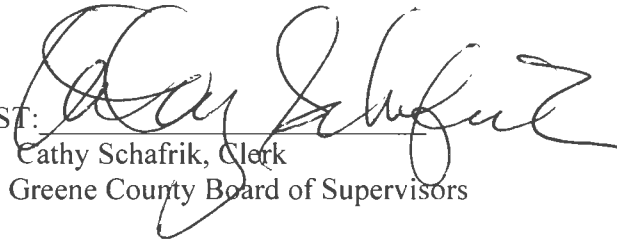
